

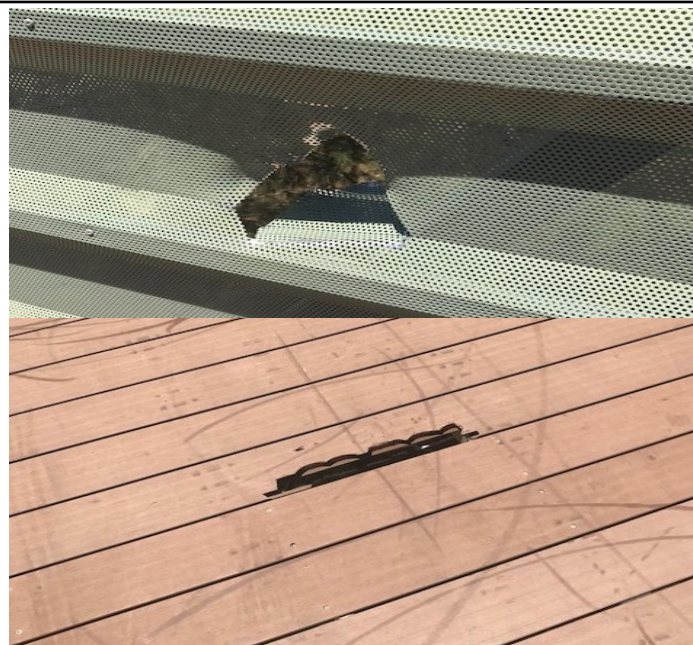
Damage to Newcastle Footbridge

During January 2018 the Newcastle Footbridge once again suffered damage, by what can only be described as an act of vandalism. The Police have been notified.

The Newcastle footbridge, which spans the river from Newcastle Park is a popular route taken by Toodyay District High School students walking to and from school as well as being used by the community as a whole.

This recent damage included holes in the floor boards and guard sheeting of the footbridge with sections of the guard sheeting also being cut.

The Shire of Toodyay has carried out minor repairs to ensure that the footbridge is safe for use until materials arrive to replace the damaged floor and guard sheeting. However while the Shire makes every effort to have the footbridge remain open for use for the community, further damage to the footbridge may result in its closure for an indefinite period of time in order for repairs to be carried out. Updates will be posted on the Shire website.



Museum News

This year is the 150th anniversary of the arrival of the "Hougoumont" in Fremantle, marking the end of 80 years of continuous penal transportation to Australia.

Out of 279 convicts on board, we know of 35 men who eventually came to Toodyay. Of these, 32 were sent to the Toodyay Convict Depot prior to receiving their Conditional Pardon, including 8 Irish political prisoners known as Fenians – agitators for an independent Irish Republic.

Our Toodyay Convict Hiring Depot exhibition will be running until the end of this year at the Newcastle Gaol Museum. Currently a database made up of convicts association with Toodyay is being assembled by Beth Frayne and the Toodyay Historical Society. So far 1,788 names have been found and as this information becomes available we are updating our exhibition.

The latter years of transportation to Western Australia saw the worst offenders being sent to the colony. Our new booklet about Toodyay's "Hougoumont" convicts examines the crimes committed by these men as well as the sentences they received.

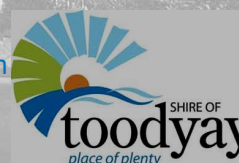

Anzac Park Redevelopment

The Anzac Park redevelopment is almost complete with the additions of the silhouettes yet to be installed.

Due to the previous sloping nature and uneven surfaces at the site, this made viewing and access difficult, particularly for war veterans and the elderly.

The creation of a larger viewing area with paved footpaths, additional seating, new garden beds, retaining walls and disabled access point has greatly contributed to the overall aesthetics and access to the site.

Some of the upcoming events to be held at Anzac Park will be Anzac Day Commemorations on 25 April 2018, the centenary anniversary of the end of World War 1 on the 11 November 2018 and we look forward to the centenary celebrations of the Toodyay RSL Sub Branch on the 7 October 2019.

This project has been made possible with grant funding from the Wheatbelt Development Commission and the Department of Veteran Affairs as well as budgeted expense from the Shire of Toodyay.



NOTICE TO ALL RESIDENTS

Throughout 2018, the Bushfire Risk Management Team will be conducting on-site field assessments of all land within the Shire of Toodyay.

This is part of an ongoing project to identify assets at risk from Bushfire and to create a Bushfire Risk Management Plan for the Shire. The inspections do not require the land owner/occupier to be present. Due to the large number of properties that have to be inspected individual appointments cannot be made; however private land owners are welcome to participate should they wish.

Officers will be in clearly signed Bushfire Risk Vehicles and wearing Shire and Department of Fire & Emergency Services uniforms, they will also carry photo ID should anyone wish to confirm their identity.

If Officers are unable to access your property a notice will be left for you to make contact with them. Alternatively you can contact the Bushfire Risk Management Planning Co-ordinator, John Hansen at the Shire offices on 9574 9300.

What to do when you see those flashing lights.....
