

## WORKS REQUEST

The Shire of Toodyay Works and Services Department endeavours to be pro-active when it comes to road maintenance, however, sometimes we need the assistance from community members to report issues or request works.

To report an issue you can:

- ◇ Visit the Shire Website and use the 'Report an Issue' option on the Shire's main page.
- ◇ Visit the Shire's Admin Office or Depot in person to fill in a Works Request Form.
- ◇ Phone the Shire's Admin on 9574 9300 or the Shire Depot on 9574 9360

Other than basic routine maintenance requests, the Shire will aim to respond to all individuals that report an issue.

## Firebreak Inspections

Firebreak Inspections by our Rangers have commenced.

Rangers can and will enter properties as per *Section 14 of the Bushfires Act* to ensure that all areas of the property comply with the Firebreak Notice (or approved variations), mitigate risk of fire travelling where possible and for larger properties allow safe passage for our Bush Fire Brigade if the need ever arises.

Non-compliance may result in an infringement and/or recovery of costs associated with bringing the property to a compliant level. The requirements of the Fire-break Notice must be maintained until 30 April annually.

## Prohibited Burning Period

The Shire has entered the Prohibited Burning Period. Permits are no longer being issued and no fires may be lit during this period. This includes camping/cooking fires and garden refuse.

Residents are also reminded to be aware of possible Total Fire Bans or Harvest, Vehicle Movement and Hot Works Bans during Summer Months. To subscribe to a SMS Notification Service for Harvest, Vehicle Movement and Hot Works Bans, please text:

## BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

*Shire of Toodyay*

Additional Restrictions during the Limited Burning Times Pursuant to Section 24G(2) and Section 25(1a) of the *Bush Fires Act 1954* and applicable to all persons, the burning of garden refuse and lighting of camping or cooking fires is prohibited within the Local Government district of Toodyay during the Prohibited Burning Period. Furthermore, pursuant to Section 24G(2) of the *Bush Fires Act 1954* and applicable to all persons, the burning of garden refuse is prohibited within the Local Government district of Toodyay during the Restricted Burning Period unless a valid permit to burn has been obtained from a Fire Control Officer. Section 24C (Terms Used) of the *Bush Fires Act 1954* contains definitions relevant to this Notice.

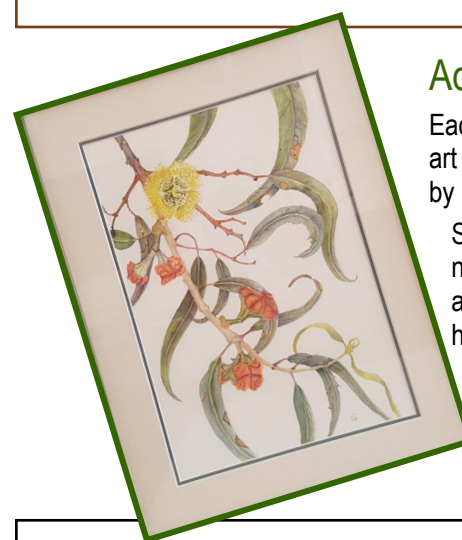


## Addition to the Shire Art Collection

The Illyarrie is a Red-capped gum or Helmet nut gum, a mallee which grows locally in the Toodyay area.

Council is still no further advanced on the reopening of the Duke Street Foot Bridge. The State Government, Public Transport Authority and Arc Infrastructure, have not given the Shire Administration a final plan to enable the bridge to pass a safety audit to allow the bridge to be reopened. Council will not be taking control of the bridge with a huge impost to the Community as was the case with the bridge over the Avon river to the School.

Council adopted the Strategic Community Plan at the October 2018 OCM after many months of consultation with community groups and residents to create a vision for Toodyay for the next ten years.

Council also adopted the 2019 Schedule for Community Meetings: *Morangup*: Morangup Community Centre on 20 March 2019 and 30 November 2019; *Bejoording*: Bejoording Fire Shed on 4 May 2019 and 4 September 2019; *Toodyay*: Toodyay Memorial Hall on 12 June 2019 and at the Toodyay Community Centre on 27 July 2019.

Council voted to change the Ordinary Council meeting days and replace the Forum with Agenda Briefings for 2019.

Agenda Briefings (non decision making meetings) will be held on the third Tuesday of each calendar month (except December) commencing at 4.00pm. Ordinary Council Meetings will be held on the fourth Tuesday of each calendar month (except December) commencing at 4.00pm.

Strategic Council Meetings will be held quarterly on the second Tuesday of the months of February, May, August and November, commencing at 7.30pm.

Representatives from Destination Perth and Tourism WA toured the Avon Valley and are enthusiastic about working collaboratively.

Shire staff have recently attended various networking and training events including the Destination Perth AGM, Instagram training, Trails Forum, Tourism Council of WA Networking, and an Agritourism workshop (held by our very own Chamber of Commerce). Updates to the Pioneers' Pathway (a drive trail from Toodyay to Merriden) are underway, with the working group looking to relaunch the website and Facebook page early next year.

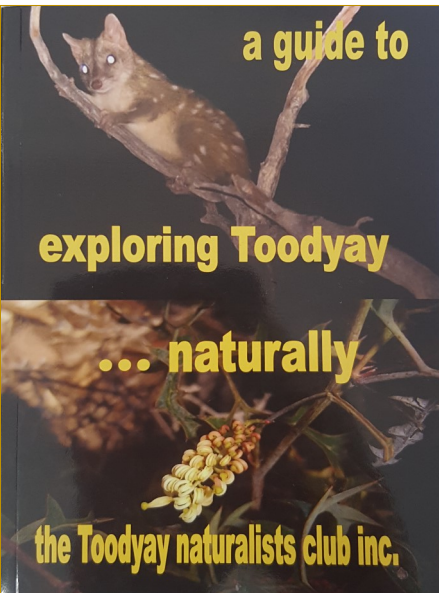

Celebrating 50 Years

There is no doubt Toodyay is rich in community groups many of them have been in existence and active for a very long time.

This is certainly true of the Toodyay Naturalists' Club who celebrate their 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year.

In 1968 when a group of concerned local farmers got together to promote and protect the natural history of the Shire.

From those humble beginnings the Club has chartered an impressive course of expanding membership and conservation achievements.

Core business has always been the monthly meetings that invariably feature outstanding key note speakers.

Members and guests have been treated to an array of presentations on fascinating subjects from to wildlife to exploration and adventure.

Many a local have taken to the podium highlighting the talent and richness of experience within our community.

Apart from monthly meetings the Club regularly heads out on field trips, camp outs and excursions often lead by people eminent in their field.

Some of the Club's conservation projects over the years include the establishment of the James Drummond Memorial and Garden at the Pelham Lookout, the installation of the John Masters Bird Hide at Red Banks Pool and the creation of the Dawn Atwell Nature Reserve.

Other campaigns have been the establishment of the Avon Valley National Park, the Morangup and Wongamine Nature Reserves, the first local government roadside flora protection policy and more recently the protection of the Helena and Aurora Range.

There has been an untold amount of data gathered by Club members from countless biological surveys and monitoring work conducted over the past 50 years.

The Club has produced and published a vast array of newsletters, articles and brochures including three books with the latest produced this year as a part of the golden anniversary.

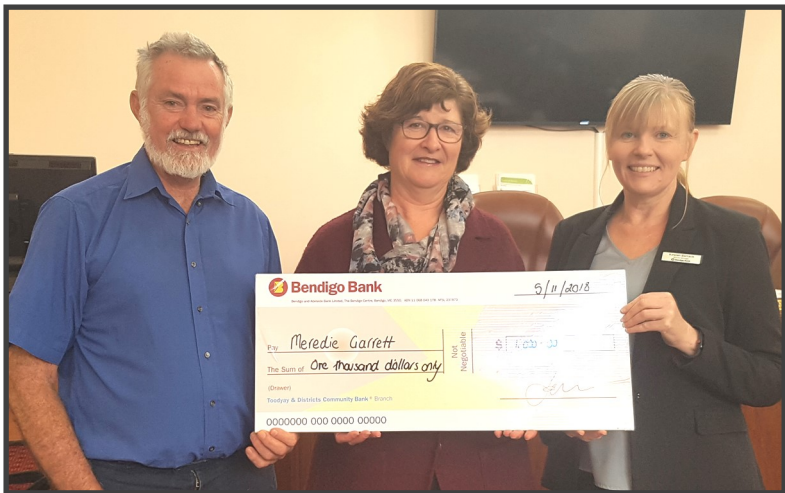

**Road Ribbon for Road Safety® campaign**

The Road Ribbon for Road Safety® campaign is a community-based road safety initiative which allows individuals to directly contribute to raising awareness of the importance of road safety over the Christmas / New Year holiday period. The campaign messages are aligned with Towards Zero, WA's road safety strategy 2008-2020 and urge people to take care on the roads during the festive season.

The WA Local Government Association's (WALGA)'s RoadWise has invited the Shire of Toodyay to join Roadwise in contributing to road safety in Western Australia by participating in, and promoting networks, the 2018 Road Ribbon for Road Safety® campaign.

This year the campaign will commence on Sunday, 18 November 2018. This coincides with the United Nations World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims. The campaign will run through until Friday, 4 January 2019.

The annual Road Ribbon for Road Safety® campaign is a community-based statewide initiative aligned to Towards Zero, WA's road safety strategy 2008 – 2020. **WA toughens council laws**

The Western Australian Government has announced new legislation that will toughen consequences for council members who impede the function of local government bodies.

The government's Local Government Amendment (Suspension and Dismissal) Bill 2018 enables the Minister for Local Government to suspend or dismiss an individual council member, resulting in suspension of their pay.

Previously, the Minister could only take action against an entire council, which has impeded the local government's ability to get on with the job of providing good governance to their community due to the actions of an individual.

"I continue to acknowledge the overwhelming numbers of elected members across the State who are working very hard to deliver quality services to their communities. From time to time, the actions of an individual serving on council can greatly impact the effectiveness of the overall local government," State Minister for Local Government David Templeman said.

The new laws will also enable a local government to recover any fees or allowances paid in advance to the member, for the period of suspension, ensuring they are held accountable for their actions.

Under the legislation, the Minister will also be able to provide an order for remedial action, with or without suspension, and suspend an individual councillor during a local government inquiry if it is likely the inquiry would be seriously prejudiced otherwise.

Local Photographer wins International Award

Toodyay Local, Georgina Steytler was recently awarded the prestigious International Wildlife Photographer of the Year, presented in London by BBCs Liz Bonnin.

Georgina and her husband have lived in Toodyay for almost ten years. At around the time of moving to Toodyay, Georgina took up nature photography with a focus (pardon the pun) on birds.

Since moving to Toodyay they have joined a number of community groups and even taken up caring for orphaned kangaroo joeys. Georgina spends a lot of time photographing birds in and around Toodyay - if you see a mad woman lying in the mud by the river with a large lens then that is probably Georgina. "Toodyay has many beautiful and wonderful animals and many of my images of the wildlife around the Shire have won awards in the Australian Geographic Nature Photography competition".

The image that won the Invertebrates: Behaviour category of the Wildlife Photographer of the Year awards in October 2018, was taken at Lake Walyormour, near Goomalling. Georgina was taking photos of Mulga parrots when she spotted the mud-dauber wasps collecting mud from the last pool of water. It was fascinating behaviour as they would mine for the best mud, roll it into a ball and transport it to their nest site. To take the image, Georgina needed to lie flat, down in the mud and take thousands of photos. The winning image was the only one in which she captured the two wasps in perfect focus.

"As to the future, I will continue to take photos of the nature that we are blessed to have all around us in Toodyay and hope to inspire other residents to do the same. I think we underestimate how special and unique Australian wildlife is. It is tempting to think you need to go to Africa or South America to get great wildlife images, but its not true. With patience and dedication, you can get amazing wildlife images from your own backyard." Georgina said.
